In 2012, my wife, Suzanne, and I started the Ricky & Suzanne Barnes Foundation with the mission of promoting the physical and mental wellbeing of children. We felt strongly about giving back to the community in which both of us grew up. We held our inaugural pro-am golf tournament at Stockton Golf and Country Club in October, 2012.

The success of this event has allowed us to donate over \$800,000 in our first eight years. This year's beneficiaries were the First Tee of San Joaquin, ONE TLC (the school for the homeless), Child Abuse Prevention Council, Hospice of San Joaquin, and Family Promise.

Through its educational programs and the game of golf, The First Tee builds character, instills life-enhancing values, and promotes healthy choices. Although this program is a national organization (promoted by the PGA Tour and its members), the San Joaquin chapter is locally funded and relies on contributions through fundraising. The monies from the Ricky Barnes Foundation are earmarked to maintain and expand the programs that directly impact youth such as: Golf Fore Girls and expanding the after-school programs at school sites.

With the goal of exceeding last year's fundraising, we are seeking sponsors and contributions for our September 12, 2022 golf tournament. Your contribution can help make a difference in the lives of the boys and girls in San Joaquin County.

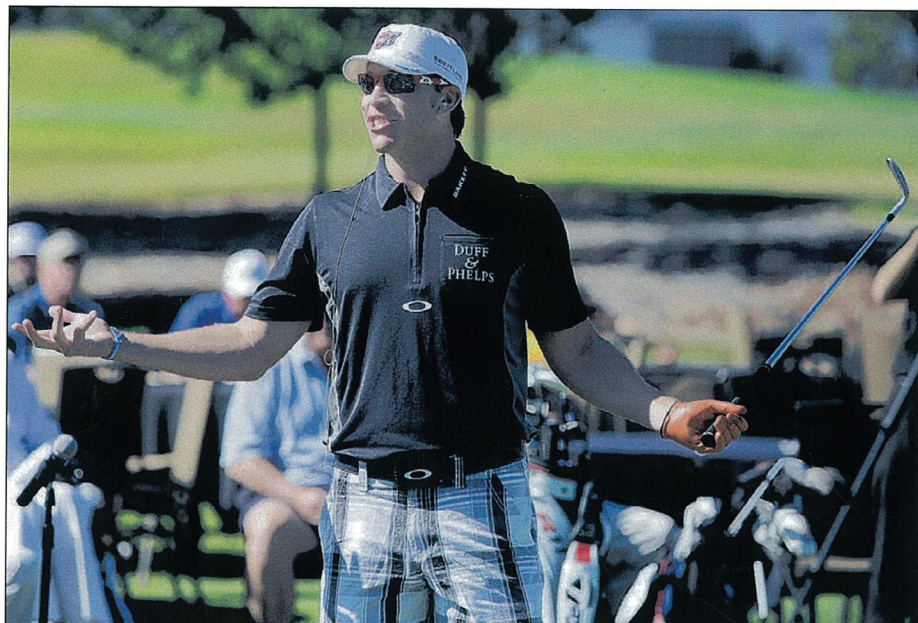

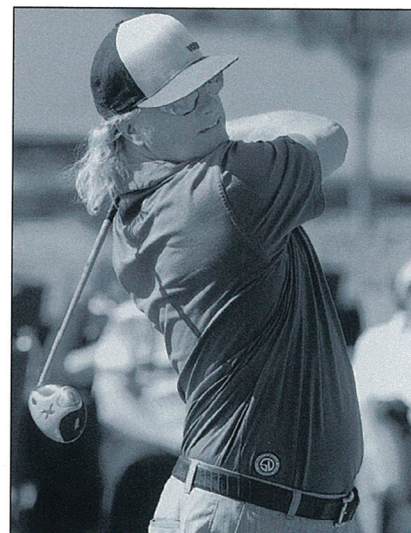

and is in solid shape to finish inside the top 125 and keep his PGA Tour card for 2013.

Barnes selected childhood obesity as one of the charities he wants to support because he battled weight issues as a child. Barnes has adhered to a strict exercise and nutrition regimen for many years and today is one of the most-fit players on the tour. Barnes even squeezed in a workout at the club's facility prior to Monday's event.

"That's one that's near and dear with me because I struggled with it until I was 15," he said. "But it's a huge, huge issue in this country."

Hometown booster

Ricky Barnes gives back with charity golf event

STOCKTON — PGA Tour pro Ricky Barnes and his wife, Suzanne, returned to their hometown Monday to put on what they hope will become an annual event.

The inaugural Ricky Barnes Charity Pro-Am at Stockton Golf and Country Club drew dozens of members of the community together with some PGA Tour pros for a clinic, a round of golf and a banquet with proceeds benefitting the First Tee of San Joaquin and programs that help fight childhood obesity.

"After about two years of planning, we finally created it and here we are today," said Barnes, a Lincoln High graduate and 2002 U.S. Amateur champion, who has been an ambassador for the First Tee of San Joaquin the past several years. "We have a lot of good people in the community that donated their time without us even asking."

Cathy Barnes, proud mom: "This is a really good thing for Stockton and our community. It's important to Ricky and Suzanne to help the place where they grew up."

Barnes, 31, and several of his friends on the PGA Tour flew to Stockton from Las Vegas on Sunday evening after competing in the Justin Timberlake Shriners Hospital for Children Open. Barnes and PGA Tour pros Kevin Stadler, John Mallinger, D.J. Trahan, James Driscoll, Colt Knost, Charley Hoffman, Greg Owen and Golf Channel "Big Break" winner Derek Gillespie hit various shots and offered tips during a clinic shortly before everyone hit the course.

"Ricky came to me and asked me to be part of it," said Mallinger, who played in a Canadian Tour event in 2006 at Brookside Country Club in Stockton, where he lost to Pacific graduate Matt Hansen in a four-way, sudden-death playoff. "I know how much Ricky cares about Stockton and what it means to him. We all try to help out as much as possible."

Barnes, Mallinger and several of the other pros who took part in Monday's event are playing this week in the Frys.com Open at

Corde Valle in San Martin.

Barnes, who is in his fourth season on the PGA Tour and ninth as a pro, has family in Stockton and still feels deeply connected with the city. He lives in Phoenix with his wife Suzanne (Stonebarger), a former volleyball standout at Linden High, Nevada and on the pro beach volleyball tour, and their 14-month-old son, Brady. Suzanne's family also lives in the area. Both families helped put on Monday's event.

"Everyone has been positive," said Barnes' mother, Cathy Barnes. "This is a really good thing for Stockton and our community. It's important to Ricky and Suzanne to help the place where they grew up."

Late last year, Barnes donated \$10,000 to the First Tee of San Joaquin and this season, he pledged \$50 for every birdie and \$250 for every eagle he makes on the tour to the organization, which teaches life skills through golf. The total so far: \$15,900 for 293 birdies and five eagles. Barnes is 104th on the PGA
